The State experienced severe flooding in our western and central counties, in addition to widespread power outages, damaged roads and bridges, water control facilities, fire departments, and other critical infrastructure. The main impact has been the widespread flash flooding and river flooding. Many rivers/streams crested at devastating levels, along with a storm surge of three feet from the inland sound side of Dare County. We had many major and minor highways, and roads that were closed or partially blocked as a result of damages incurred due to flooding. There were three confirmed deaths and the state experienced strong wind gusts leading to the formation of a tornado in Guilford County and tornado warnings being issued in two additional counties. 9. Description of the nature and amount of State and local or Indian tribal government resources which have been or will be committed. Include additional details in enclosed Governor's or Tribal Chief Executive's cover letter. A state of emergency was declared for all 100 counties, the SEOC was activated on October 10, 2018 and over thirty (30) local governments issued states of emergencies for their areas in response to the State and the National Weather Service's warning of dangerous conditions. Nearly as many Emergency Operations Centers were opened. At its peak there were 14 shelters activated in order to protect the citizens of this State with over 100 individuals seeking assistance. Response activities undertaken to protect lives and property during the storm included but were not limited to evacuations, swift water rescue, search and rescue and high water rescue. The State utilized National Guard resources, EMS teams, swift water rescue teams, Incident Management Teams, volunteer organizations and support staff.
