A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, approximately one in every 2,500 pregnancies are diagnosed with a congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH); and

WHEREAS, CDH occurs when the diaphragm muscle fails to close during prenatal development, and the contents of the abdomen migrate into the chest through this hole; the estimated survival rate of babies borh with CDH is 50 percent; and

WHEREAS, CDH is as common as spina bifida and cystic fibrosis; however, very few people are aware of this congenital defect; and

WHEREAS, 1,600 babies are born with CDH every year in the United States; and

WHEREAS, there are many people living in North Carolina who have been diagnosed with and have survived their CDH; however, many families in North Carolina have endured the horrible pain and grief associated with the loss of loved ones with CDH; and

WHEREAS, those with CDH often endure multiple surgeries and possible medical complication beyond their diagnosis – such as heart defects, pulmonary complications, gastric and intestinal problems, and developmental delays – and may require respiratory and medicinal support for years; and

WHEREAS, raising awareness of this congenital defect will help bring about acceptance and support for those suffering with it, and will help advocate for urgently needed medical research and advances;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2018, as "CONGENITAL DIAPHRAGMATIC HERNIA AWARENESS MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
