A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, sarcoidosis is a potentially debilitating and deadly multi-organ inflammatory disease, estimated to affect 200,000 people in the United States; there is no known cause, cure, or reliable treatment to slow or halt the progression of chronic cases; and

WHEREAS, the signs and symptoms of sarcoidosis vary widely depending on the person and organs affected, and can include debilitating fatigue; shortness of breath; difficulties with balance and coordination; irregular heartbeat; visual problems, including blindness; pain affecting joints and muscles; weakness or numbness of limbs; skin rash and discoloration; mood disorders such as depression and anxiety; organ failure; and sleep difficulties; and

WHEREAS, sarcoidosis affects people of all ages, races, and genders, but is most common among adults between the ages of 20 and 40; although sarcoidosis can affect anyone, the incidence in African-Americans is more than 3 times higher than in Caucasian Americans, and the disease is more likely to be chronic and fatal in African-Americans; and

WHEREAS, sarcoidosis is a diagnosis of exclusion as there is no objective test or biomarker; numerous diagnostic tests and ongoing clinical observation and/or management lends to the high economic burden of this disease, including great costs to patients and family members; and

WHEREAS, volunteers, researchers, caregivers, and medical professionals are working to improve the quality of life and prognosis of people with sarcoidosis and their families; however, more research is needed to find effective treatments and improve care for those living with the disease today;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2018, as "SARCOIDOSIS AWARENESS MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
