A PROCLAMATION

and WHEREAS, the term muscular dystrophy (MD) does not refer to a single disease or disorder that affects everyone the same way; instead, it is an umbrella term covering more than 52 different types of muscular and neuromuscular diseases ranging in severity;

WHEREAS, all muscular dystrophies result in progressive muscle weakness, beginning with mild muscle weakness and advancing to complete paralysis of all voluntary muscles, including those used for breathing and/or swallowing; and

dystrophy; and WHEREAS, more than one million individuals in the United States are currently living with a disease that causes muscular

WHEREAS, anyone can be affected by muscular dystrophy regardless of race, sex, age, or ethnicity; and

WHEREAS, research has recently yielded four new drugs to treat four types of muscular diseases, providing treatment for more diseases than has been available in the previous five-decade fight against neuromuscular diseases; and

WHEREAS, raising public awareness of muscular dystrophy will continue to facilitate the discovery of treatments and cures, as well as increase funding critical to providing services and supporting families of those affected by muscular and neuromuscular

WHEREAS, Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Month is a special opportunity to educate the public about MD, and garner support for issues important to the muscular dystrophy community; and

WHEREAS, advocates of muscular dystrophy awareness are encouraged to "Light It Up Green for MD" by lighting cities, state capitols, and landmarks in lime green throughout the month of August to show their support for this cause;

"MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim August, 2017, as ULAR DYSTROPHY AWARENESS MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
