A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Honor Guards demonstrate high regard for the traditions of the United States Armed Forces and honor the servicemembers and veterans who have sacrificed to protect our nation; and

WHEREAS, the Honor Guard is comprised of brave men and women who serve in all branches of our military as well as law enforcement, fire service, public safety, emergency medical services, corrections, and other agencies; and

WHEREAS, all those who wear the uniform of the Honor Guard provide an important service to their communities; and

WHEREAS, the Honor Guard helps to recognize our servicemembers and veterans by presenting the colors in services for the fallen, community memorials, and other events that recognize our military or public servants; and

WHEREAS, the Honor Guard acts as the face of the organization they represent during solemn times of mourning and remembrance, and provide solace to families and communities during times of grief; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina joins in recognizing the service and sacrifice of our Honor Guards who commemorate and pay tribute to those who have served with honor, dignity, and respect;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim July 1, 2018, as "HONOR GUARDS DAY" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
