A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, National Summer Learning Day celebrates the importance of keeping children learning, safe, and healthy all summer and ready to succeed in the school year ahead; and

WHEREAS, during the summer months, children can lose what they learn; most students lose two months of math skills every summer, and children from low-income families typically lose an additional two to three months of reading; and

WHEREAS, summer learning loss during elementary school contributes to an academic achievement gap later in life; approximately two-thirds of the ninth-grade reading achievement gap between children from low-income families and their peers from middle income families can be attributed to learning loss that happened during the summers of their elementary school years; and

WHEREAS, parents can help prevent learning loss by reading with their children and by encouraging their children to read independently throughout the summer break; and

WHEREAS, public agencies, community and faith-based organizations, schools, libraries, museums, recreation centers, and camps provide summer programming that plays an important and trusted role in the education and well-being of our children; and

WHEREAS, summer learning is a vital part of our collective effort to ensure all students are ready for school and reading on grade-level by the end of third grade for academic and lifelong success; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages all students, parents, guardians, families, and individuals to champion summer learning in support of academic achievement for every child in our state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim July 12, 2018, as "SUMMER LEARNING DAY" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
