A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, North Carolina peaches are grown on 1,200 acres and account for nearly \$7 million in annual farm income, according to the 2015 agricultural statistics from the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; and

WHEREAS, peach production in North Carolina is concentrated in the Sandhills region of the state, with additional acreage in western North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina's climate and soil conditions allow for an extended harvest period across the state, from the mountains to the coast; and

WHEREAS, full cling, semi-cling and freestone varieties allow North Carolinians to enjoy fresh peaches all summer; and

WHEREAS, peaches are a low-calorie snack, with large amounts of vitamin A, as well as healthy amounts of calcium, iron, and vitamin C; and

WHEREAS, peaches are the perfect addition to ice creams, sherbets, jams, jellies, pies, and countless other desserts; and

WHEREAS, the industry also provides employment for many of our state's citizens, and opportunity for supplemental income for rural families who farm on a part-time basis; and

WHEREAS, the peach industry is yet another part of the total diversification of agriculture in North Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim July, 2017, as "**PEACH MONTH**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
