A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome (TS) is an inherited neurological disorder, often referred to as a Tic Disorder, which is characterized by repetitive, involuntary motor and vocal tics; and

WHEREAS, many co-occurring conditions are prevalent along with TS, such as Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADD/ADHD), Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), anxiety, learning disabilities, and depression; and

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome affects one in every 100 children in the United States; and

WHEREAS, while school-age children in North Carolina dealing with TS are treated with medication under the care of knowledgeable doctors, greater awareness can speed the development of a standard treatment and, ultimately, a cure for this disorder; and

WHEREAS, increased education and awareness of best practices to identify, counsel, and treat patients with TS will help to correct the misconception that it is a behavior or conduct disorder, and thereby prevent misdiagnosis; and

WHEREAS, broadening public and professional knowledge of TS can lead to more acceptance and better quality of life for children and families dealing with this disorder; and

WHEREAS, the TSA Greater Carolina Tourette Syndrome Support Group is a resource that specifically assists North Carolinians by providing support to those with TS and their families; educating teachers, families, and the community on the facts of TS; and working to generate awareness in the state; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages public acceptance, understanding, and compassion to dismantle the stigma related to Tourette Syndrome symptoms, ensuring that those with TS and Tic Disorders will have no barrier to achieving their full personal and professional potential;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim June 4, 2017, as **"TOURETTE SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY"** in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
