SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS WEEK

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, North Carolina is an active location for severe weather; in 2017, our state experienced 30 tornado touchdowns, 104 flood or flash flood incidents, 548 severe thunderstorm or wind events, and 102 damaging hail storms resulting in more than \$60 million in statewide damages; and

WHEREAS, last year, the National Weather Service in North Carolina issued 85 tornado warnings, 561 severe thunderstorm warnings, and 57 flash flood warnings; the average warning lead time for severe weather and tornadoes was 20 minutes, and 100 minutes for flash flood warnings; and

WHEREAS, severe thunderstorms produce hail at least an inch in diameter, wind speeds at or surpassing 58 miles per hour, and can produce a tornado; all thunderstorms that produce lightning and lightning strikes are a significant threat in North Carolina – if you hear thunder, go indoors; and

WHEREAS, taking steps now to prepare for severe weather and practicing what to do when severe weather strikes can help prevent injuries and loss of life; and

WHEREAS, families and individuals should listen to local radio, television, or a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration radio station for information on severe weather; and

WHEREAS, residents, businesses, and schools are urged to participate in the statewide tornado drill on Wednesday, March 7, 2018, at 9:30 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, families should make emergency plans that detail how to get to a safe location, contact each other, and get back together; include in your plan the safest locations on regularly traveled routes; and

WHEREAS, individuals should have emergency supply kits in their homes and vehicles, including first aid kit, batterypowered radio, flashlight, non-perishable food, bottled water, sturdy shoes, and work gloves; and

WHEREAS, ReadyNC.org and its mobile application are available to provide current weather and traffic conditions and to help residents with their emergency preparedness plans; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina urges all communities and individuals to organize appropriate activities that promote awareness of severe weather and how to stay safe;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim March 4 – 10, 2018, as "SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS WEEK" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
