A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages people to continue to participate in our state's long-standing support of the children and loved ones of our fallen patriots – past, present, and future;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 13, 2018, as "CHILDREN OF FALLEN PATRIOTS DAY" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
