A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), also known as brittle bone disease, is a genetic disorder characterized by fragile bones that break easily; a person born with this disorder is affected throughout his or her lifetime; and

WHEREAS, there are different types of OI with a range of severity from mild to life threatening; and

WHEREAS, because there is no cure for OI, treatment focuses on minimizing fractures, surgical correction, reducing bone fragility, and maximizing mobility and independent function; and

WHEREAS, increased funding for education and research is needed to help find more effective treatments; and

WHEREAS, the Osteogenesis Imperfecta Foundation has designated May 5 - 12 as National OI Awareness Week, a time when board members, staff, medical professionals, and volunteers are joining together to focus attention on OI and increase awareness of this disorder;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 5 – 12, 2018, as "**OSTEOGENESIS IMPERFECTA AWARENESS WEEK**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
