A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, American Education Week, recognized and celebrated the week prior to the week of Thanksgiving since 1921, was created and sponsored by the National Education Association and the American Legion to observe public schools as the backbone of our democracy, providing opportunities and strengthening every community; and

WHEREAS, public schools help cultivate a passion for learning, inspire curiosity and imagination, and unlock the potential of young people; and

WHEREAS, public education provides a pathway to economic success, and serves as an economic linchpin to every community, bringing together adults, children, educators, business leaders, volunteers and elected leaders in North Carolina; public education is the top employer in 69 of North Carolina's 100 counties, and a top five employer in every county; and

WHEREAS, all education employees – teachers, school counselors, custodians, bus drivers, staff, and administrators – work tirelessly to go the extra mile each day for our students; yet, too many public schools lack the resources they need to prepare students for success; and

WHEREAS, each year, the North Carolina Association of Educators plans a week of activities for parents, community members, and elected leaders to learn more about public schools and the work of all educators in schools across our state; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages citizens to observe this week by supporting our local schools and educators, for whom every week is education week;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim November 13 – 17, 2017, as “**AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
