A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, North Carolina is home to more than 800,000 active military and veteran families; and

WHEREAS, more than 40 percent of active duty military officers and 75 percent of military veterans in the United States live as part of a family; and

WHEREAS, more than 276,000 military and veteran family members are supported by North Carolina's four major military installations, while more than 600,000 live in communities throughout our state; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina's military and veteran families contribute \$66 billion to our state annually, representing roughly 10 percent of the economy; and

WHEREAS, more than 80,000 businesses in North Carolina are veteran owned; military and veteran families are employed in more than 578,000 jobs in our state, and contribute more than \$34 billion in personal income to their local economies and communities; and

WHEREAS, transitioning military officers and veterans supply invaluable skills to our workforce, and strengthen resilience across numerous private sector industries statewide; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina's military and veteran families are local leaders in our communities, inspiring in our citizens a spirit of service and reverence; and

WHEREAS, military and veteran families are an invaluable asset and treasure to the state of North Carolina, and we honor their sacrifice, pride, and service this month and always;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim November, 2017, as "**MILITARY FAMILY APPRECIATION MONTH**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
