A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, a group of young women from Smithfield Graded School started a library in 1912 by collecting books as admission to a pantomime; and

WHEREAS, that library eventually became the Smithfield Public Library; and

WHEREAS, the Johnston County Commissioners approved the creation of the Johnston County Public Library in 1941; and

WHEREAS, the Johnston County Commissioners and Smithfield Town Council approved the merger of the two libraries forming the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield in 1966; and

WHEREAS, the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield opened to the public in a new building at the corner of Market and Third Streets in 1967; and

WHEREAS, expansion into the building next door to the library was completed in 2003, increasing the library's size to 34,000 square feet; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield joined NC Cardinal, a library consortium that now has 161 branches and over 6.4 million items available to its members; and

WHEREAS, the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield's mission is to enhance the overall quality of life in its communities by promoting and developing readers of all ages and cultivating in them a passion for lifelong reading and learning; and

WHEREAS, the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield is a bedrock institution of its communities that continues to create young readers, inspire lifelong learning, connect its patrons to an online world, stimulate imaginations, and provide a comfortable place for its community members to gather; and

WHEREAS, 2017 marks the 50th anniversary of the Public Library of Johnston County and Smithfield;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 2, 2017, as "PUBLIC LIBRARY OF JOHNSTON COUNTY AND SMITHFIELD DAY" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
