A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 2015, United States Senator Jeanne Shaheen of New Hampshire introduced a resolution to designate the first week in November as National Veterans Small Business Week; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina is home to more than 800,000 military personnel, including more than 773,000 veterans, representing nearly 10 percent of our total population; and

WHEREAS, veterans are integral to the growth of our national and North Carolina economies; and

WHEREAS, veteran entrepreneurs are an essential component of the small business development community in North Carolina and throughout the United States; nearly 2.5 million American businesses are owned by veterans, who employ nearly six million workers; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, service disabled veteran owned small businesses won more than \$6 billion in federal contracts; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina has more than 80,000 small businesses that are wholly or partially owned by veterans; and

WHEREAS, military and veteran families in North Carolina are employed in more than 578,000 jobs in our state, and contribute more than \$34 billion in personal income to our local economies and communities; and

WHEREAS, this week is dedicated to supporting our veteran entrepreneurs, and encouraging consumers to purchase goods and services from our local veteran owned businesses;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 30 – November 3, 2017, as "**NORTH CAROLINA MILITARY VETERANS SMALL BUSINESS WEEK**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
