WHEREAS, more than 705,000 people in our state are estimated to have a substance use disorder; and

WHEREAS, the United States and North Carolina are currently experiencing an Opioid Crisis and Epidemic; and

WHEREAS, to help more people achieve and sustain long-term recovery, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services invites all residents of North Carolina to participate in National Recovery Month;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September, 2017, as "ALCOHOL AND DRUG ADDICTION RECOVERY MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
