A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, every day, first responders risk their own safety to protect others; and

WHEREAS, first responders are our primary and best defense against all emergencies that threaten our communities; and

WHEREAS, first responders are ready to aid the people of North Carolina 24 hours a day, seven days a week; and

WHEREAS, first responders show courage and selfless concern for others as they carry out their duties; and

WHEREAS, first responders are highly-trained, specialized workers who contribute their excellent skills for the public good; many first responders provide this service voluntarily for no pay; and

WHEREAS, the members of first responder organizations undergo significant education and training and make personal sacrifices to achieve the expertise required to provide aid in emergency situations; and

WHEREAS, first responders maintain safety and order in times of crisis, volunteer in our communities and schools, and are a vital part of every North Carolina community;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September, 2018, as "FIRST RESPONDERS APPRECIATION MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
