A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 1967, the North Carolina General Assembly ratified a bill that led to the first Friday after March 15 being designated annually as Arbor Day in our state; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina is proud to be home to a wide variety of trees and diverse wildlife attractions; and

WHEREAS, trees help reduce erosion of topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate our temperatures, clean our air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource that provides paper, wood for homes, fuel for our fires, and other wood products; and

WHEREAS, trees increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of businesses, beautify our communities, and improve our quality of life; and

WHEREAS, trees are a source of great pride and all North Carolinians are encouraged to support efforts to protect trees and woodlands, and to plant trees for the well-being of this and future generations;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim March 22, 2019, as "**ARBOR DAY**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
