A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, esophageal cancer is one of the fastest growing cancer diagnoses in the United States; the American Cancer Society estimates 17,650 new cases and 16,080 deaths from esophageal cancer in 2019; and

WHEREAS, esophageal cancer is among the deadliest cancers with fewer than 1 in 5 patients surviving 5 years; and

WHEREAS, despite its rapid increase and poor prognosis, esophageal cancer receives very little research funding; the National Cancer Institute Funded Research Portfolio shows esophageal cancer distribution at less than 1 percent of total cancer funding; and

WHEREAS, esophageal cancer can be a silent killer with patients often unaware that the heartburn, difficulty swallowing, cough, hoarse voice, sore throat, or chest pain that they suffer can be indicators for this disease; all of these symptoms are reasons to discuss screening for esophageal cancer with a health care professional; and

WHEREAS, esophageal cancer is often discovered during advanced stages but if discovered early, chances for recovery and survival are far better; treatments for the disease include surgery, chemotherapy, radiation, and laser therapy; and

WHEREAS, during Esophageal Cancer Awareness Month, the State of North Carolina encourages people to raise awareness of this disease, know the symptoms, and promote early detection and treatment;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2019, as **"ESOPHAGEAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH"** in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
