**A PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, March has been designated by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) as Music In Our Schools Month®, encouraging schools across the nation to focus on music education; and

**WHEREAS**, Music In Our Schools began with a one-day event in New York in 1973, and has grown into a month-long celebration of school music; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this celebration is to raise awareness of the importance of music education and to remind us that school is where all children should have access to music; and

**WHEREAS**, Music In Our Schools Month is an opportunity for music teachers to bring their music programs to the attention of the school and the community, and to display the benefits that school music provides students of all ages; and

**WHEREAS**, music education shapes the way our students understand themselves and the world around them, allowing for a deep engagement with learning; the skills nurtured by music education – such as creativity, collaboration, communication, and critical thinking – are vital to students' academic, personal, and professional success; and

**WHEREAS**, throughout March, music educators and students across North Carolina will demonstrate the importance of quality music programs to the lives of young people, with concerts featuring songs such as “The Star-Spangled Banner,” “The Old North State,” and “I Love the Mountains”; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina joins our music students and educators in celebrating the power of music education;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim March, 2019, as “**MUSIC IN OUR SCHOOLS MONTH**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
