A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, myalgic encephalomyelitis (ME), chronic Lyme disease (CLD), fibromyalgia (FM), and multiple chemical sensitivity (MCS) are all complex immunological and neurological diseases that affect millions of people and cause substantial economic burden to North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, ME, also referred to as chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS), is a complex disease involving profound dysregulation of the central nervous system and immune system, dysfunction of cellular energy metabolism and ion transport, and cardiovascular abnormalities; ME is often misdiagnosed as chronic fatigue syndrome or fibromyalgia; and

WHEREAS, CLD can be severely disabling with a post-sepsis like outcome; this disease necessitates accurate testing and is often misdiagnosed as ME, FM, or multiple sclerosis; and

WHEREAS, FM is characterized by severe pain in muscles, ligaments, and tendons; and

WHEREAS, MCS can cause a person to experience allergic-like reactions when exposed to pollutants; and


WHEREAS, some forms of these diseases can leave patients homebound and/or bedbound, resulting in social isolation, financial hardship, risk of mental illness and suicide, or death; and

WHEREAS, advocate Thomas Hennessy, Jr., an ME and Lyme patient, chose May 12 as an awareness day for these illnesses to commemorate Florence Nightingale, who suffered from an ME-like illness; and

WHEREAS, increased awareness can help people and families dealing with these diseases throughout North Carolina receive appropriate medical intervention, compassionate care, and support;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 12, 2019, as “**MYALGIC ENCEPHALOMYELITIS, CHRONIC LYME DISEASE, FIBROMYALGIA, AND MULTIPLE CHEMICAL SENSITIVITY AWARENESS DAY**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
