A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the United States has become increasingly diverse in the last century and is projected to become even more diverse in the coming decades; and

WHEREAS, although health indicators such as life expectancy and infant mortality have improved for most Americans, some minorities experience a disproportionate burden of preventable disease, death, and disability compared with non-minorities; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina's racial and ethnic minority groups account for approximately 36 percent of our state's population; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities in the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services is to promote and advocate for the elimination of health disparities among all racial and ethnic minorities and other underserved populations in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services and its divisions, programs, and staff continue the vital work of building partnerships across our state to eliminate health disparities, using health equity strategies to ensure that all people can have good health and well-being;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2019, as "NATIONAL MINORITY HEALTH MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
