A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, bullying is physical, verbal, sexual, or emotional harm or intimidation intentionally directed at a person or group of people; and

WHEREAS, bullying occurs in neighborhoods, playgrounds, and schools, as well as through technology such as social media platforms; and

WHEREAS, research shows that bullying is among the most common forms of violence, affecting millions of American children and adolescents every year; and

WHEREAS, nearly 30 percent of students in grades 6-12, including thousands of North Carolina children and adolescents, have experienced some form of bullying; and

WHEREAS, targets of bullying are more likely to acquire lifelong physical, emotional, and learning problems; and

WHEREAS, students who are repeatedly bullied often fear such activities as riding the bus, going to school, and attending community activities; and

WHEREAS, children who bully are at greater risk of engaging in more serious violent behaviors; and

WHEREAS, children who witness bullying often feel less secure, more fearful, and intimidated; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages students, parents, schools, recreation programs, religious institutions, and community organizations to engage in bullying awareness and prevention activities designed to make our communities safer for all children and adolescents;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October, 2018, as **"BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH"** in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
