A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Caroline Adelaide Shaw, born in Greenville, North Carolina, is one of the most prolific female composers of our time; and

WHEREAS, at 30, she became the youngest recipient of the Pulitzer Prize for Music for her "Partita for 8 Voices," written for the Grammy-winning Roomful of Teeth, of which she is a member; and

WHEREAS, Shaw is an accomplished vocalist, violinist, composer, and producer who performs in solo and collaborative projects across genre and media; and

WHEREAS, she has studied at Rice, Yale, and Princeton Universities and held residencies at Dumbarton Oaks, the Banff Centre, Music on Main, and the Vail Dance Festival; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, Shaw represented North Carolina in the debut performance of her violin concerto, Lo, with the North Carolina Symphony at the Shift Festival, presented by the Kennedy Center and Washington Performing Arts; and

WHEREAS, her devotion to education and outreach has inspired young composers and musicians everywhere to expand their creativity and become more innovative, genre-shaping artists; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina commends Caroline Shaw for her many contributions to art, music, and culture throughout our state and nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 21, 2018, as a day "IN RECOGNITION OF CAROLINE SHAW" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
