A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) are increasing nationally and in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, STDs impact the lives of tens of thousands of North Carolinians each year; in 2017, there were a combined 88,741 cases of chlamydia, gonorrhea, infectious syphilis, and HIV infection diagnoses in our state; and

WHEREAS, some demographic communities are disproportionately burdened by the STD epidemic, including young people and people of color; and

WHEREAS, unborn infants who are exposed to these infections in the womb are at risk for life-long disability and even death; and

WHEREAS, it is the right of every North Carolinian to have access to comprehensive and culturally competent sexual health care; there are numerous proven STD prevention tools including comprehensive risk reduction education, condoms, and vaccines to prevent Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, and Human Papilloma Virus (HPV); and

WHEREAS, routine screening and rapid treatment of individuals diagnosed with an STD and their partners help to safeguard the health of all North Carolina residents, families, and communities; and

WHEREAS, scientific advances in HIV prevention and care have made it possible to foresee a future where there are no more HIV transmissions in North Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April, 2019, as "STD AWARENESS MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
