A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, donating blood is a vital way to save lives and help patients of all ages and backgrounds;
and

WHEREAS, a sufficient blood supply is a public health issue both locally and nationally, and our hospitals and medical centers need a readily available supply for our residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, one blood donation can help up to three patients, and although an estimated 38 percent of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, less than 10 percent actually do; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina is home to a number of committed private and public organizations working to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation, including the American Red Cross, Community Blood Centers of the Carolinas, local hospitals and many others; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Blood Donation Day serves to remind us that we need to constantly replenish our blood supply through donation and community awareness; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina urges people to donate blood if you are eligible, and support our local blood drives; we can all do our part to help protect and save lives;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 5, 2019, as **“BLOOD DONATION DAY”** in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
