A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, orofacial clefts are the most frequently occurring birth defects in the United States, affecting an estimated 1 in 700 infants per year; and

WHEREAS, infants born with clefts and other craniofacial conditions usually require surgery as well as special feeding support, dental and orthodontic care and speech therapy as they grow; and

WHEREAS, these complex services need to be provided in a synchronized manner over a period of years and are best provided by interdisciplinary cleft and craniofacial teams; and

WHEREAS, organizations such as the American Cleft-Palate Craniofacial Association serve populations affected by craniofacial differences and the professionals who care for them, helping these infants get a healthy start to life by providing their families with comprehensive information, support and connections to these interdisciplinary teams; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to recognize the efforts of organizations and families working to ensure a better life for those affected by cleft lip/palate or other craniofacial conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim July, 2019, as “**CLEFT AND CRANIOFACIAL AWARENESS MONTH**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
