**A PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, dyslexia is a language-based learning disability that affects approximately one in five people, regardless of race, gender, age, or socioeconomic status; and

**WHEREAS**, neurological in origin, dyslexia affects the way the brain processes information, and is characterized by difficulties with reading, writing, and spelling despite normal intelligence; and

**WHEREAS**, those with dyslexia benefit greatly from specialized assistance from highly trained teachers, multi-sensory learning programs, and individualized instruction; and

**WHEREAS**, early identification, alternative instruction, and extra support from friends, family, and teachers can contribute to the success dyslexic students enjoy in the classroom and later in employment; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2017 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly, House Bill 149/Session Law 2017 - 127, was enacted, requiring the State Board of Education and local boards of education to develop tools to ensure identification of students with dyslexia and dyscalculia; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina encourages all educators, schools, students, and individuals to increase awareness and understanding of dyslexia, and to show support for those with dyslexia in our communities this month and throughout the year;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October, 2020, as “**DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
