A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, hypophosphatasia (HPP) is an inherited disorder that affects the development of bones and teeth; and

WHEREAS, this condition disrupts mineralization, which is a critical process for the formation of strong bones and teeth that can withstand chewing and grinding; and

WHEREAS, symptoms of HPP vary widely and can appear anywhere from before birth to adulthood; many people with the disorder experience non-trauma fractures, chronic pain, fatigue, and more; and

WHEREAS, the most severe forms of the disorder tend to occur before birth and in early infancy causing seizures, pneumonia, and distorted breathing from the soft malformed chests; it is estimated 1 in 100,000 newborns suffer from severe HPP; and

WHEREAS, there is currently no cure for HPP; research is ongoing and important advances are being made in understanding the genetic causes for HPP; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages awareness and support for those battling hypophosphatasia and organizations that aid in the effort to find a cure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 30, 2019, as "**HYPOPHOSPHATASIA AWARENESS DAY**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
