**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina joins in celebrating National Nurses Week, and commends the more than four million nurses who protect and promote the health of their communities nationwide;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 6 – 12, 2020, as "**NORTH CAROLINA NURSES WEEK**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
