A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed non-skin cancer and second leading cause of cancer-related deaths among men in the United States; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1 in 9 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime, and more than 2.9 million men in the United States who have been diagnosed with prostate cancer at some point are still alive today; and

WHEREAS, in North Carolina, it is estimated that more than 7,500 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer and more than 1,000 men will die of prostate cancer in 2019; and

WHEREAS, African-American men are disproportionately affected, with a prostate cancer incidence rate almost 60 percent higher and mortality rate two to three times greater than Caucasian men; and

WHEREAS, education regarding prostate cancer and early detection strategies are critical to saving lives and preserving and protecting quality of life; and

WHEREAS, additional focus is needed on the personal and social burdens of prostate cancer to anticipate additional needs and provide support to the patient, their family and other caregivers; and


WHEREAS, regular screenings as recommended by a physician, improved awareness of prostate cancer risks and continued medical research and advances can improve outcomes and support for those and their families affected by prostate cancer, as well as treatment-related side effects and complications resulting from this disease; and

WHEREAS, individuals diagnosed with prostate cancer can speak with their health care providers to learn more about the disease, find support groups and services in their community or online and determine treatment that considers a quality of life balance with their unique diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages people to become informed about cancer detection and to raise awareness, promote resources and advocate support for men and their families affected by this disease in our communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September, 2019, as “**PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH**” in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
