### A PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, members of the transgender community are engaged as productive residents of our state who contribute to North Carolina's progress and prosperity; and

**WHEREAS**, transgender people continue to face high levels of discrimination, fear, stigma, and bias that can fuel abuse and violence against North Carolina's transgender community; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina benefits from the diversity of its population and seeks to promote inclusion of all people as a testament to our shared values of dignity, equity, and fair treatment for everyone without regard to gender identity or expression; and


**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina, through its public laws, policies, and practices, condemns any and all acts of violence; and

**WHEREAS**, Transgender Day of Remembrance helps bring public awareness to hate crimes against transgender people and honors the memory of those harmed and killed by senseless acts of violence each year; and

**WHEREAS**, on this day of observance, North Carolina commits to moving forward together to promote inclusion, equity, and understanding of transgender people in every community across our state;
