PARDON OF INNOCENCE
for
TEDDY LAMONT ISBELL, SR.

WHEREAS, during the December 2003 Term of Buncombe County Superior Court, Teddy Lamont Isbell, Sr. ("Isbell") pled guilty to Conspiracy to Commit Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon, Docket Number 03-CRS-000093; and

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2003, by judgment of said Court, Isbell was sentenced to a minimum term of sixty-six (66) months and a maximum term of eighty-nine (89) months in the custody of the then-North Carolina Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2014, counsel for Isbell filed a Motion for Appropriate Relief ("MAR") in Buncombe County Superior Court, seeking a judicial determination of actual innocence; and

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2014, February 13, 2015, July 24, 2015, and September 30, 2015, the Honorable Judge Joseph N. Crosswhite heard the MAR proceedings; and

WHEREAS, based on the Court's findings of fact, Judge Crosswhite found Isbell had demonstrated his actual innocence by clear and convincing evidence; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2015, Judge Crosswhite, based upon evidence tending to establish Isbell's innocence of the crime for which he was convicted, concluded that his conviction should be vacated and dismissed all charges against Isbell; and


WHEREAS, Isbell now seeks a Pardon of Innocence from the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina is vested with the exclusive authority under the state constitution to issue pardons to individuals upon such conditions as he may think proper.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Cooper, Governor of the State of North Carolina, in consideration of the above factors, and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution of the State, do by these presents PARDON the said TEDDY LAMONT ISBELL, SR., it being a Pardon of Innocence.
