tomorrow; and WHEREAS, to achieve that goal, our state must work to strengthen education from early childhood through K-12 to postsecondary education and the workforce so that students graduate prepared for the jobs of today and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 116C-3, the North Carolina Education Cabinet is tasked with developing and maintaining a strategic design for the continuum of education programs across the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned members of the North Carolina Education Cabinet do hereby:

- sixty-six percent, by 2030; and twenty-five through forty-four who hold postsecondary credentials or degrees to at least two million, or Endorse the myFutureNC Commission's goal to increase the number of North Carolina residents ages
- Commit to pursuing policies and programs within North Carolina that will help our state achieve that
- goal; and Call on the myFutureNC Commission to track the state's progress toward reaching the goal and report annually to the North Carolina Education Cabinet on that progress.
