### A PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, Mexico had been under Spanish rule for three centuries when, on September 16, 1810, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla rallied and united the people of Mexico towards independence; and

WHEREAS, each year, Mexicans throughout the world gather to celebrate and reflect upon the history and individuals that led to and shaped their nation's independence; and

**WHEREAS**, each year, *Mes Patrio*, Mexico's Independence Month, is celebrated throughout September, and Mexico's Independence Day and freedom on September 16; and

**WHEREAS,** North Carolina is a culturally diverse state, and is proud to be home to many residents of Mexican heritage; among all North Carolina Hispanic or Latino residents, including those born in the United States, 54 percent identify Mexican as their primary ancestry; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina has been increasingly shaped by the economic, social, and cultural contributions of the Mexican community; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina encourages residents across the state to join in celebrating the remarkable history and heritage of Mexican Independence, and wishes all who celebrate a happy *Mes Patrio*;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim September, 2024, as "**MEXICAN INDEPENDENCE MONTH**" and September 16, 2024, as "**MEXICAN INDEPENDENCE DAY**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
