**WHEREAS**, these servicemembers and veterans are true leaders in our communities who impart courage, honor, valor, and dignity to their fellow North Carolinians; and

**WHEREAS**, during Military Appreciation Month, we are reminded of the essential role that the United States Armed Forces have played in the history and development of North Carolina, our great nation, and the world; and

**WHEREAS**, the North Carolina Department of Military Affairs and the people of North Carolina deem it is our responsibility this month and throughout the year, to honor, support, and recognize our North Carolina servicemembers and veterans, and remember with deep gratitude those who have given their lives in defense of our freedom;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May, 2024, as "MILITARY APPRECIATION MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
