A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, a cancer survivor is defined as anyone living with a history of cancer, from the moment of diagnosis through the remainder of life; and

WHEREAS, according to data from the North Carolina Central Cancer Registry, the overall five-year relative survival rate for all cancers in North Carolinians from 2015 to 2019 was 64.4 percent; and

WHEREAS, this relative survival rate is slightly lower than the 65.6 percent overall five-year relative survival rate for all cancers from 2013 to 2017; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Comprehensive Cancer Control Program's coalition provides an annual NC Cancer Survivorship Summit that brings together cancer survivors, cancer patients, and caregivers to share their experiences; learn the latest cancer treatments, research, and psychosocial issues; learn self-advocacy skills; and empower survivors throughout their lives; and

WHEREAS, cancer survivors and their families exhibit courage, faith, and strength to undergo the emotional, physical, and financial burdens associated with their disease; and

WHEREAS, cancer survivors are encouraged to create a survivorship care plan to record their cancer and treatment history, health checkups or follow-up tests needed in the future, possible long-term effects of treatments, as well as ideas for staying healthy; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina encourages residents and health care providers to learn how they can support cancer survivors during all stages of cancer survivorship and offer care, support, and palliative services during their unexpected cancer journey;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim June, 2023, as "NATIONAL CANCER SURVIVORSHIP MONTH" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
