A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, North Carolina has a strong history of improving lives and strengthening communities through volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, during National Volunteer Week, we celebrate the impact of volunteer service and come together to tackle community needs and foster a culture of civic engagement; and

WHEREAS, volunteer service is needed more than ever as people work to support their public schools and volunteer in the classroom to assist educators and students; and

WHEREAS, volunteers have dedicated countless hours to meeting the critical needs of North Carolinians and helping individuals survive and recover from natural disasters; and

WHEREAS, state employees, led by the North Carolina Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service, will work to enhance quality of life for North Carolinians through volunteer and community service; and

WHEREAS, National Volunteer Week was enacted in 1974 by President Richard Nixon to celebrate the spirit of volunteerism; urging all Americans to seek opportunities to provide service to their community; and

WHEREAS, the federal agency, AmeriCorps engages millions of people each year in service nationwide through programs and volunteer generation grants; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina residents are encouraged to learn about local volunteer opportunities, volunteer centers around the state, and volunteer recognition at VolunteerNC.org; and

WHEREAS, National Volunteer Week should serve as a catalyst for residents to serve our state today; to commit to volunteer by signing up now for a volunteer slot with a food bank, disaster recovery workday, in a school and more; to promote volunteerism in our families and communities through an invitation to serve together; and to be all in for North Carolina when it is needed most;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSH STEIN, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim April 20-26, 2025, as "NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
