A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina strives to ensure that our state is a great place for people to grow older while thriving within families, neighborhoods, and communities; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina is routinely recognized as one of the best states for retirees, ranking 9th in the nation for number of people aged 65 and older; currently, one in six North Carolinians is aged 65 or older, and by 2025 it will be one in five; and

WHEREAS, the United States Administration for Community Living has designated the 2024 theme for Older Americans Month as *Powered by Connection*, emphasizing the profound impact of meaningful interactions and social connection on the well-being and health of older adults in our community; and

WHEREAS, older Americans improve our communities through intergenerational relationships, community service, civic engagement, and many other activities; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina must ensure that its older residents have the resources and support needed to stay involved in their communities, reflecting a commitment to inclusivity and connectedness; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Advisory Council on Aging and the Senior Tar Heel Legislature advocate for older adults and promote awareness of issues surrounding aging; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 280 was signed on May 2, 2023, establishing North Carolina's commitment to building an age-friendly state and ordering the Department of Health and Human Services to implement a planning process to develop a multisector plan for aging in North Carolina and directing all cabinet agencies to cooperate with implementation of this Executive Order;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May, 2024, as "**OLDER AMERICANS MONTH**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
