A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Monday, January 27, 2026, is International Holocaust Remembrance Day, which marks the eighty-first anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp; and

WHEREAS, this is a day of remembrance for the six million Jews who were murdered by Nazi Germany from 1933 to 1945; and

WHEREAS, on this anniversary, the State of North Carolina recommits itself to combating the global rise in anti-Semitism; and


WHEREAS, as of August 2024, thirty-five U.S. states plus the District of Columbia have adopted a non-legally binding “working definition” of anti-Semitism; and

WHEREAS, the working definition reads as follows: “Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities.”; and

WHEREAS, anti-Semitic attacks, currently on the rise, are an assault on the humanity of all people; and we should always take time to remember the millions of men, women, and children who were killed simply because of their beliefs and their heritage; and we must avow that the atrocities and genocide of the Holocaust never be repeated;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSH STEIN, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim January 27, 2026, as “**INTERNATIONAL HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY**” in North Carolina and commend its observance to all residents.
