**A PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, Americans from every corner of our nation reported for duty during the Vietnam War, and we are grateful for their services and their sacrifices; and

**WHEREAS**, thousands of servicemembers returned home burdened by visible scars as well as the invisible wounds of post-traumatic stress and Agent Orange exposure; and

**WHEREAS**, we bear witness to the more than 58,000 names etched into two faces of black granite in our nation's capital, a lasting memorial to those who bore conflict's greatest cost; and

**WHEREAS**, today we reaffirm one of our most fundamental obligations – to show all who have worn the uniform of the United States the respect and dignity they deserve and to honor their sacrifice by serving them as well as they served us; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina and the North Carolina Department of Military and Veterans Affairs are grateful for the strength and service of our Vietnam veterans, and we honor their proud legacy with our deepest appreciation;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, JOSH STEIN, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim March 29, 2026, as “**VIETNAM VETERANS DAY**” in North Carolina and commend its observance to all residents.
