## COMMUTATION ORDER

FOR

**JOSHUA CHASE MCKAY**

**WHEREAS**, JOSHUA CHASE MCKAY, at the August, 2002 Term of Richmond County Superior Court, pled guilty to Second Degree Murder, Docket Number 01-CRS-053992, Assault Inflicting Serious Injury, Docket Number 02-CRS-050227, Felonious Breaking and Entering, Larceny After Break/Enter, Docket Number 01-CRS-050984, Felonious Breaking and Entering, Larceny After Break/Enter, Docket Number 01-CRS-050985, Larceny of a Firearm, Docket Number 02-CRS-051568, Burning Unoccupied Building, Docket Number 01-CRS-051033 and by judgement of said Court was sentenced to a minimum term of 20 years in the custody of the then North Carolina Department of Correction; and

**WHEREAS**, it has been made to appear to me that this case is one fit for a Commutation;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Roy Cooper, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution of the State, do by these presents **COMMUTE** his sentences to time served subject to the following conditions:

1. He shall not commit any felony, Class A1 misdemeanor, or impaired driving offense under the laws of the United States of America or any of its States or Territories;
2. He shall waive extradition to the State of North Carolina for any State of the United States of America or any of its Territories and will not contest any effort by any State or Territory to return him to the State of North Carolina in the event he violates any conditions of this Commutation Order;
3. He shall report promptly to his assigned community corrections officer when instructed to do so and in a manner prescribed by that officer;


4. He shall not own or possess any firearms or deadly weapons;
5. He shall not assault, harm, or threaten to assault or harm, any person;
6. He shall not intentionally modify his residence or employment without prior approval of his/her community corrections officer;
7. He shall not leave the State of North Carolina without the permission of the Director of the Community Corrections Section, North Carolina Department of Public Safety or his/her designee;

The conditions of this Order are limited to a term of one (1) year from the effective date of this Order. Compliance with the conditions of this Order shall be monitored by the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Community Corrections Section and any violations shall be promptly reported to the Office of the Governor. If the Governor, or his successor, finds that JOSHUA CHASE MCKAY has violated any of the conditions herein provided, then the Governor or his successor may, in his or her discretion, revoke or modify the Commutation granted this day.

This Commutation Order shall not extend to any other offenses whereof the said JOSHUA CHASE MCKAY may be guilty.
