The Appalachian College Advising Corps places recent college graduates in high schools throughout Western NC to serve as full-time College Advisers. The goal of the Appalachian College Advising Corps is to increase the number of first-generation,



low income, and underrepresented students who enter and complete some form of postsecondary education.

Appalachian State University: Public Health AmeriCorps

ASU Public Health AmeriCorps aims to recruit, train, and develop new generations of public health leaders ready to respond to public health needs through public health service and capacity building in North Carolina's rural Appalachian communities. The project will have 15 Public Health AmeriCorps members who will be (1) leading the dissemination and implementation of Psychological First Aid (PFA) interventions to communities, organizations, and professionals; (2) recruiting and retaining Medical Reserve Corps Members to implement and sustain the PFA interventions; and (3) delivering pre and post emergency/trauma RAPID-PFA

Collaborative Action in Rural Education (CARE) Corps will create equitable, resilient spaces in rural schools and communities to tutor, teach, and provide mental health support for youth and families in eastern NC. The Rural Education Institute (REI) will support 97 CARE Corps members who will serve as peer tutors/mentors (Resiliency CARE Corps Members), classroom teaching support (Teaching CARE Corps Members), and mental health clinicians (Counseling CARE Corps Members).

Pamlico Rose Institute Public Health Corps



To help counter the adverse impact of COVID 19 on food insecurity in under resourced people, PRI Health Corps members will bring a farm to fork approach, building several community gardens for groups such as women Veterans, the legally blind, and school aged children in eastern North Carolina.
