- 4 of the 6 most recent NC Principals of the Year are MSA graduates












Comprehensive Recruitment and Admission

We establish a professional partnership with school districts for improved communication, innovation, and collaboration for preparing school principals






Program Delivery accommodates working educators

- Locations of cohort programs are based on clusters of students' geographical locations
- Class one evening per week. Semesters with two courses, classes alternate each week using either in person or online work
- Tuition and fees at distance education rate real savings
- Internship seminars one evening per month with field work
- Full-time students attend class twice a week in year 1 and once a week in year 2 with remaining 4 days in full-time internship


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


Principal Preparation

Internship

- Public school and university supervisors work as a team
- Each student completes 1,000 hours of hands on experience in school leadership
- Monthly seminars focus on social justice and equity topics leaders will face about:
